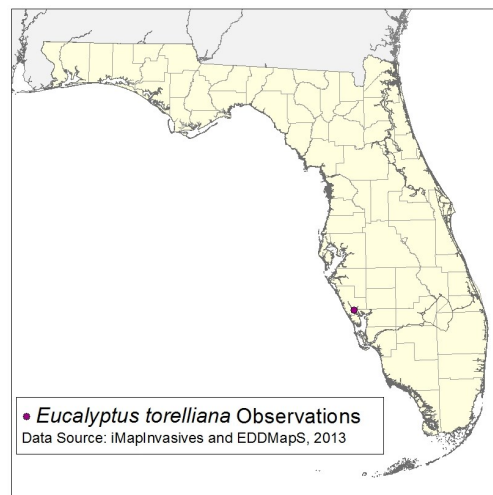

Description: Evergreen tree to 30 m tall; bark rough grey to black on lower trunk, smooth gray-green above. Alternate or opposite leaves, simple, leathery and rough to touch, ovate to 20 cm long and 11 cm wide, with wavy margins. Small creamy white flowers in clusters with numerous stamens. Fruit a large, nearly round woody capsule with many reddish seeds.

Note: *Eucalyptus torelliana* has a wider leaf than most eucalypts.

Habitat: Disturbed sites, open woodlands

Comments: Vouchered from Palm Beach and Lee Co.

Florida Introduction Date: specimen vouchered in 2001

Control Methods:

No specific recommendations available, woody species can generally be treated with basal bark or cut-stump application of herbicides.
