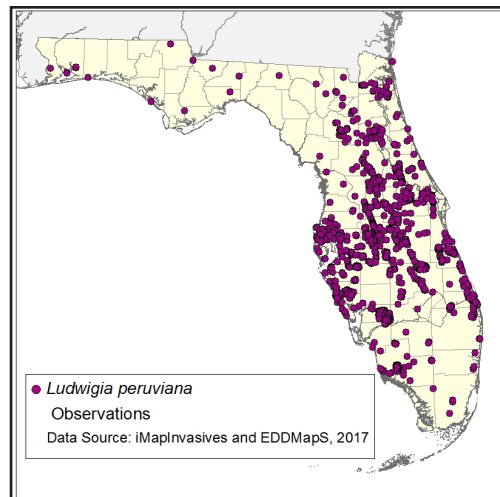

Description: Peruvian primrosewillow is a perennial (sometimes deciduous) shrubs that favors wetlands and wet ruderal areas such as roadside ditches. Plants have pubescent stems when young. The leaves are alternate and hairy. The flowers are showy, bright yellow and borne solitary with four petals.

Habitat: swamps and lake ad pond margins. Common, nearly throughout Florida.
