

Description: Robust shrub with basal rosette of stiff leaves to 3.5 m in diameter with a woody flowering stalk to 10 m in height. Leaves linear-lanceolate, fleshy, with marginal spines. Flowers on terminal panicles, white, fragrant, 2.5-3.3 cm long.

Habitat: Dry, disturbed sites, coastal uplands, rockland hammock, scrub

Florida Introduction Date: specimen vouchered in 1979

Control Methods: .

Chemical: Foliar (2,4-D or triclopyr amine, Motooka et al.).
